

Dear Residents,

Enclosed is key budget information. The budget process allowed us to look at our spending and revenues to present a well-planned and responsible budget to our taxpayers in support of the education of our students.

Our Board of Education, on April 17, 2018, adopted a school budget in the amount of \$7,504,092. The State of New York has its budget in place with an increase in aid to our district.

With a commitment of fiscal responsibility, the Board of Education, Administration, Staff, and Faculty, have done more with less over the past few years. Our efforts to maintain a high quality education for our students is still our top priority.

This years' spending plan is based on a tax levy increase of 1.99% which reflects a \$31,723 total local dollar increase district wide. Our proposal is below the Property Tax Cap limit allowed.

The proper balance of a stable environment and culture for our staff and students, with realistic requests for taxpayer support, is very important.

Proposed Budget in Review

The Crown Point School Board continues to make important fiscal decisions. This has allowed us to stabilize our funding, taxpayer support and programs for our students. There are many factors that have contributed to our overall financial ability to meet the needs of our students. The following is an overview of the proposed budget:

- Maintain Staffing/Student Programs
- Support After School Programs
- Increased School Psychologist Student Support
- Significant Increases in Health Insurance Costs
- Reduced CVES Itinerant Library Services
- Two New Leased Replacement Buses
- Required Minimum Wage Increases
- Maintain Student Activities / Sports / Electives

How Much Will My Taxes Go Up?

In the past 10 years, the actual Crown Point tax rate has been reduced by \$2.56 per thousand, (from \$13.18 to \$10.62). We look to you to continue to support the Crown Point Central School based on our previous efforts to remain fiscally responsible. The proposed tax levy increase is 1.99%. In terms of dollars and cents, the tax rate on a home assessed at \$100,000 would increase by approximately:

- \$0.20 per thousand
- \$1.66 per month
- \$19.90 per year
- 5 cents per day

The actual amount of any tax increase is determined by the total tax assessments and the final equalization rates.



Auditorium Renovation Update

We appreciate your support to renovate our Auditorium. We continue to seek approval from the NYS Education Department for this project. The Facilities Planning approvals are backlogged 8-9 months. The Good news is we will be able to make progress toward our end goal. Some of the work should occur this summer. The overall project completion date will depend on the permit and construction timelines. Again, we thank you for your support of this renovation!



After School Program

The After School Program is very successful. There are 106 students in PreK-6th grade enrolled. This program has many benefits for our children and their families. We are fortunate that our Community Schools funding has increased and covers most of the program costs!

- *Maintain our National Model School and School of Distinction Status




More Information Available




